# What is Early Help?

Early Help aims to provide support as soon as a need is identified, at any stage in a child or young person's life.

At our GLA schools, we work closely with children, families and a range of external agencies to promote the welfare and wellbeing of every child. We recognise that offering support at the earliest opportunity is key to preventing concerns from escalating and helps families access the right support at the right time.

We pride ourselves on knowing our children well. We are attentive to their needs and remain vigilant in identifying situations where additional support may be beneficial.

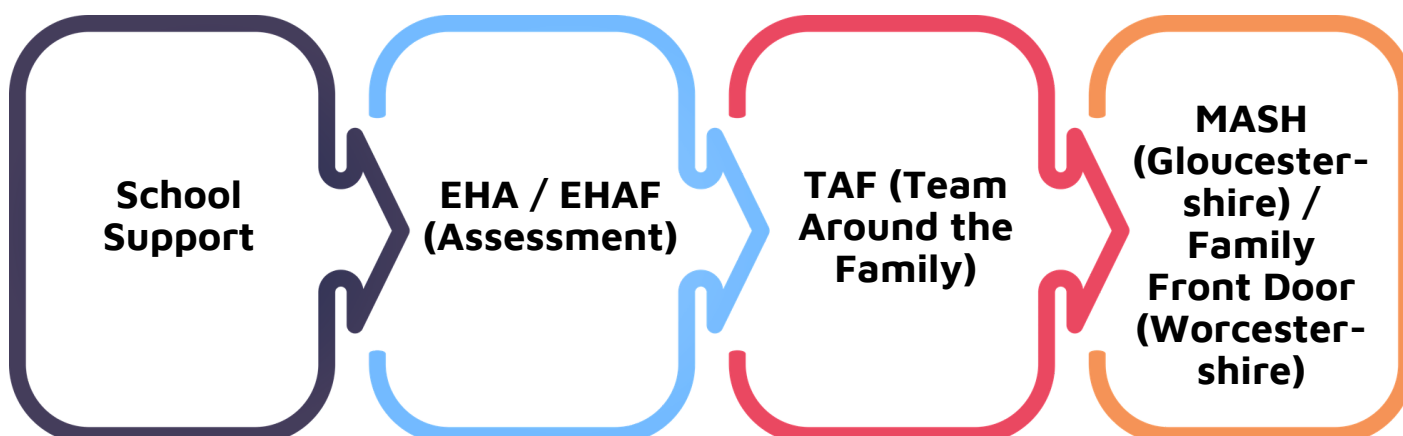
We work openly and collaboratively with families and professionals, ensuring that the child remains at the centre of everything we do.

## Who should I approach if I'm concerned that a child may need support from the school?

Early Help is a shared responsibility. You can speak to any member of the school team, who will either support you directly or pass on your concerns. In most cases, the class teacher or pastoral team will be your first point of contact.

## Graduated Pathway

### Simple Pathway Overview



- **School Support** – initial help provided by school
- **EHA / EHAF** – formal assessment to identify needs
- **TAF** – professionals work together with the family
- **MASH / Family Front Door** – referral if safeguarding concerns increase

# School Provision for Early Help



## Level 1

- Our curriculum develops the qualities and attributes children need to thrive as individuals, family members and members of society.
- Our vision underpins our commitment to the holistic needs and welfare of all our pupils.

## Level 2

- Attendance Officers and Head Teachers monitor attendance and punctuality. Concerns are communicated with parents and carers.
- Our teaching and support staff monitor demeanour, appearance and engagement as well as being alert to changes in these in their pupils and will refer their concerns to the SENDco or DSL/DDSL.
- Regular and frequent strategy meetings share concerns and decide next steps for our children ensuring open channels of communication.
- Schools have clear procedures to log concerns and respond according to assessed need. This is completed via CPOMs
- Pastoral Support complete short term interventions to meet the needs of the child.
- A TAC (Team Around the Child) may be held with agencies considered relevant or those already involved.

## Level 3

- The DSL/DDSL requests Social Care involvement through a MARF (Multi-agency Referral Form).
- GCC/WCC may contact schools as part of a MASH (Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub) enquiry.
- The DSL/DDSL engages in a multi-agency response as led by Social Care.
- The DSL/DDSL attends multi-agency Risk Assessment Conferences and Social Care Strategy meetings to share the school's perspective
- Social Care may open a case as CP/S47 (Child Protection) or CiN/S17 (Child in Need). School will be a member of the Core Group and the DSL/DDSL will attend these and conferences.
- Where concerns have their basis in SEND, the SENDCo will refer to external agencies for further assessment or will request an Education, Health and Care Plan Assessment (EHCP).
- Senior Leaders may refer to Mental Health Services, CYPS or where the concerns have their basis in the pupil's emotional/social well-being.

## Level 4

- The DSL requests immediate Social Care involvement using The Front Door (WCC/GCC) or the Portal (GCC) and may also contact the Police on 999.
- Police may contact school's through the Operation Encompass initiative to share information relevant to pupil's wellbeing.

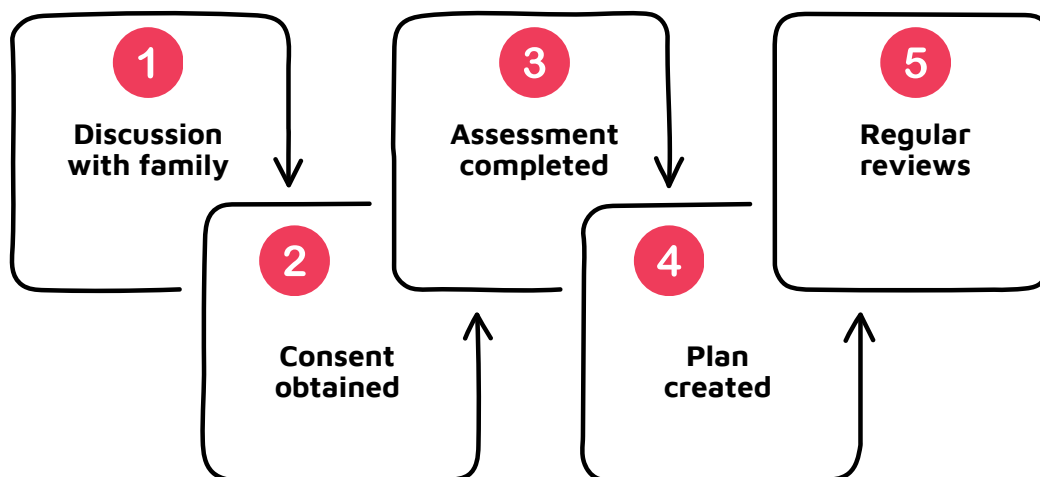

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## Children Missing in Education (CME)

This refers to 'any child of compulsory school age who is not registered at any formally approved education activity e.g. school, alternative provision, elective home education and has been out of education provision for at least 4 weeks'. CME also included those children who are missing (family whereabouts unknown) and are registered at a school but the family is not at their last known address, has not taken up a school place, has 10+ days of continuous absence without explanation or has left school suddenly but the destination is not known.

## Fabricated and induced Illness (FII)

This is a rare form of child abuse and is when a **parent (usually the child's biological mother) or carer exaggerates or deliberately causes symptoms of illness in a child**. FII is also known as 'Munchausen's syndrome by proxy' which is not to be confused with Munchausen's syndrome where a person pretends to be ill or causes illness or injury to themselves.

## Female Genital Mutilation (FGM)

This comprises all the procedures that involve partial or total removal of the external female genitalia. FGM is illegal in the UK and from October 2015 mandatory reporting commenced. **If professionals think that an act of FGM appears to have been carried out on a child they have a legal duty to personally report it to the police.**

## Private fostering

Private fostering is an arrangement whereby a child under the age of 16 (or 18 if the child has a disability) (S. 66 Children Act 1989) is placed for 28 days or more in the care of someone who is not the child's parent(s) or a 'connected person'.

There is a duty on schools to inform children's services where they become aware of such an arrangement.
